1. REFERENCE:

a. Technician Personnel Regulation 451, Chapter 7.

b. FPM Bulletin 451-8, New Career Service Emblem, available at Truax Field, General Mitchell ANG Base, USPFO for Wisconsin and the Human Resources Office.

2. PURPOSE: This regulation prescribes the eligibility requirements and methods of presentation regarding the award of length of service emblems and certificates to technicians, providing recognition for long and faithful service.

3. ELIGIBILITY:

a. A technician becomes eligible for recognition upon completion of 10, 15, 20, 25, 30, 35, 40, 45 and 50 years of service.

b. All Federal service used in establishing the technician's Service Computation Date for retirement purposes is creditable in computing years of service for entitlement to the award.

c. The HRO office will determine on a continuing basis technicians eligible for service recognition, prepare certificates, secure emblems and forward to the appropriate individual for presentation.

4. PRESENTATION:

a. Length of service emblems and certificates will be presented to technicians by the individual designated below or their designee.

(1) Commander, 115th FW - All Truax Field Technicians (ANG).

(2) Commander, 128th ARW - All General Mitchell ANG Base Technicians.

(3) USPFO for Wisconsin - All USPFO Technicians.

(4) Commander, CRTC

(5) SMM for Wisconsin - SMM employees at Camp Williams, MATES personnel and CSMS Technicians.

(6) Commander, 128th ACS - All Technicians in 128th Air Control Squadron.

(7) State Aviation Officer - AASF Commanders.

(8) AASF Commander - All AASF Technicians.

(9) Command Unit Administrator. Technicians under his supervision.

(10) OMS Supervisors – All technicians in facility.

(11) TAG – All DMA employees and senior level officials.

(12) The HRO will notify all 30 year and above recipients for possible award presentations.

b. Presentations will be made at appropriate ceremonies, i.e., unit training assemblies, technician group meetings, social functions, etc. These awards are symbols of competent and dedicated public service, so care will be taken to focus maximum public and technician attention upon the award. Appropriate local press coverage is encouraged.

5. EMBLEM DESCRIPTION:

a. An emblem has been adopted Government wide and it is designed to symbolize and foster pride in Federal service. It establishes uniform recognition throughout the Federal service. The emblem contains the Coat of Arms of the United States which has become universally recognized as representing the United States Government. A bronze emblem will mark 10 and 15 years of service. The award for male technicians is a tie tac while the award for females is a pin.

b. Upon attainment of 20 years of service, a career service award plaque will be awarded in lieu of the tie tac or pin described above. This plaque is made of walnut approximately 7-1/4 inches wide and 10 inches long, with emblem affixed to the plaque, along with a year of service tab, a birthstone and dedication plate. Subsequent awards, i.e., 25 to 50 years will update this plaque with a new year of service tab.
