




# WING CONPLAN 14-01




## Wisconsin National Guard Civil Support Concept Plan

- Published 01 OCT 2013
- Replaced WING CONPLAN 11-01, Domestic Ops
- Provides the framework for WING Civil Support operations.
- Outlines how the WING supports Civil Authorities and cooperates with local, State, Tribal, and Federal agencies during and emergency.
- Joint Plan; tasks WIARNG and WIANG with contingency planning and force readiness requirements.



“On order, WING forces conduct civil support operations during domestic emergencies to protect lives, property, and mitigate suffering within the assigned joint operations area.”

# WI-JOC Overview

## Mission:

The Wisconsin Joint Operations Center (WI-JOC) serves as the focal point for Wisconsin National Guard (WING) domestic operations by maintaining situational awareness via a Common Operational Picture (COP), serving as a centralized communications and coordination node, and providing a command and control platform for contingency response operations.

## Capabilities:

- Operates 24/7/365 supporting routine and elevated operations
- Provides situational awareness and reporting pertaining to domestic operations and TAG CCIR
- Supports WEM and the SEOC during planning and response operations
- Provides a “single point of contact” for partner agencies and the WING

# WINGSAT

## Wisconsin National Guard Situational Awareness Team (WINGSAT)

### Mission:

On order the Wisconsin National Guard Situational Awareness Team/Commanders Assessment Element deploys to incident sites, exercises, or areas of contingency operation in order to provide forward Incident Awareness and Assessment, liaison capabilities, and command and control support.

### WINGSAT:

- Capable of Deployment in (N+4 Hours)
- Full-size truck and 18 foot communications trailer
- Can establish a WING Civil Support Liaison at the disaster area (Incident Command Post or County/Municipal EOC)
- May provide Operations, Communications, Engineering, and Aviation support, and other subject matter experts as required

# 54th CST



## Situation:

The 54th Civil Support Team is the Wisconsin National Guard's full time response team for natural or man-made events that involve weapons of mass destruction, toxic industrial chemicals or natural disasters.



## Mission:

Support local and state authorities at domestic WMD/CBRNE incident sites by identifying agents and substances, assessing current and projected consequences, advising on response measures, and assisting with requests for additional military support.



## Result:

Through 2014, the 54th CST conducted 5 Response, 26 Assist, and 13 Stand-by missions.

# 54th CST Mission Highlights



## Response:

**54th CST Support to Madison PD:** From 21-22 MAR 14, the 54thCST supported the Madison Police Department by advising Law Enforcement personnel on the hazards associated with the substances found during the execution of a search warrant at an apartment.

**54<sup>th</sup> CST Radiological Shipment Support:** On 06 OCT 14 and 10 OCT 14, the 54th CST supported the WI State Patrol (WSP) to escort a radiological shipment through the state. The CST provided radiological monitoring to ensure public safety. The shipment exited the state and the team members detached from the WSP escort.

## Stand-By:

**54<sup>th</sup> CST POTUS Visit Support:** On 28 OCT 14, the 54th CST supported the USSS and the MPD Bomb Squad with the security of the visit of the POTUS to Milwaukee, WI. The CST provided chemical, radiological, and biological detection and identification capabilities in stand-by support.

**54<sup>th</sup> CST Summerfest Support:** From 04-07 JUL 14, the 54th CST supported the 2014 Milwaukee Summer Fest in Milwaukee, WI by providing air and radiation monitoring via static monitors as well as mobile sweeps of the venue. The CST partnered with MPD, FBI, and DOE throughout the mission.

## Outreach:

**WI DOJ and DCI Outreach Mission:** On 24 FEB 14, the 54th CST conducted a capabilities brief for the Wisconsin DOJ/DCI Tactical Team at Volk Field, WI. After the capabilities brief concluded, the CST met with the DCI team leaders from around the state to coordinate future training events and response operations.





# 54th CST Exercise Highlights


**54<sup>th</sup> CST Exercise at Baron County Fairgrounds:** On 04 NOV 14 the 54<sup>th</sup> CST conducted an exercise at the Baron County Fairground and integrated into ICS operations. Exercise was to identify unknown substance and conduct joint entry operations with ICS personnel.

**54<sup>th</sup> CST Exercise with Madison PD SWAT at Fort McCoy:** On 08 OCT 14, the 54<sup>th</sup> CST conducted a training exercise with the Madison Police Department SWAT team at Fort McCoy. Conducted a simulated entry with SWAT and demonstrated decontamination capabilities.

**54<sup>th</sup> CST Exercise in Brown Deer with Milwaukee EOD:** On 11 SEP 14, the 54<sup>th</sup> CST conducted an exercise with the Milwaukee EOD in Brown Deer. Conducted a joint entry at two potential nefarious laboratories with debrief after exercise.

**54<sup>th</sup> CST Exercise at Milwaukee Amphitheater on Summerfest Fairgrounds:** On 09 SEP 14, the 54<sup>th</sup> CST conducted an exercise by responding to incident at Milwaukee Amphitheater. Initial link-up operations with Incident Command. Conducted entry and sampling exercise at location.

**54<sup>th</sup> CST Exercise at Camp Atterbury, IN:** On 07 JUL 14, the 54<sup>th</sup> CST conducted an exercise at Camp Atterbury, IN in radiological and chemical recon training.





# 115 Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD)



## Situation:

WING Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) team will support civil authorities in rendering military ordnance safe in the Area Operation.

## Mission:

- Respond to military aircraft emergencies/crash recovery
- Assist local agencies in situations involving military ordnance
- When available, assist local agencies in situations where non-military ordnance is involved

## Cumulative totals for 2014:

- 14 missions requested by Ft McCoy
- 6 missions requested by civil authorities
- 3 VIPPSA missions

## Result:

115 EOD rendered 14 munitions safe in the AO

# 115 EOD Highlights



**115 EOD Support to Pepin County Sheriff's Department:** On 25 OCT 14, , the 115 FW EOD responded to a request for assistance from the Pepin County Sheriff Department to render safe an UXO found on a local beach. The UXO was disposed of on site.

**115 EOD Support to Buffalo County Sheriff's Department:** On 30 JUL 14, the 115 FW EOD responded to a request for assistance from the Buffalo County Sheriff Department to render safe an UXO found in local residence. The UXO was found to be inert.

**115 EOD Support to Tomah Police Department:** On 03 JUN 14, the 115 FW EOD team responded to the Tomah Police Department request to dispose of 2 UXO's at a local residence. The 115 FW EOD team secured UXO's and transported to Fort McCoy, WI for disposal.

**115 EOD Support to West Salem Police Department:** On 13 MAY 14, the 115 FW EOD team responded to a request for assistance from the West Salem Police Department to render safe an artillery shell found in local residence. Shell was found to be hollow with no explosive present.

**115 EOD Support to Hillboro Police Department:** On 08 APR 14, the 115 FW EOD team responded to a request for assistance from the Hillsboro, WI Police Department to render safe a Hand Grenade found at a local residence.





# WING NGRF

**Capability:** National Guard Reaction Force (NGRF)

**Mission:** The purpose of the NGRF is to provide assistance to civil authorities for the protection of critical infrastructure and other state and/or national assets, and to conduct security operations.

- Up to 500 personnel for site security, presence patrols, roadblocks, checkpoints, force protection, and civil disturbance operations
- Ready Reaction Force (RRF): 125 personnel ready to deploy from a designated location within 6 hours of notification
- Follow-on Force: 375 personnel ready to deploy from a designated location within 24 hours

# CERFP



## Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear (CBRN) Enhanced Response Force Package

**Capabilities:** Consists of three elements.

**DECON:** Conducts ambulatory and non-ambulatory patient decontamination of hazardous materials using mobile, state of the art equipment under the supervision of medical personnel.

**Extraction:** Conducts casualty search and rescue operations in a CBRNE environment. Extraction team techniques and operations are conducted in accordance with the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1006, Standard for Rescue Technician Professional Qualifications, with emphasis on rescuer safety, breaking/breaching, debris lifting & moving, rigging techniques, rope/high angle rescue, as well as structural stabilization.

**Medical:** Utilizes the modular capability of the Air National Guard Expeditionary Medical Support (ANG EMEDS) concept while working in concert with the decontamination and/or casualty extraction teams. The Medical team provides sophisticated, pre-hospital emergency treatment, triage, and stabilization prior to evacuation from a CBRNE response/rescue site.

**Mission:** The CERFP mission is to provide immediate response capability to the governor including: incident site search capability of damaged buildings, rescuing trapped casualties, providing decontamination, and performing medical triage and initial treatment to stabilize patients for transport to medical facilities.

## Situation:

Respond to requests from civil authorities in fire support missions. Support Mutual Aid Box Alarm System (MABAS) requests for assistance.

## Mission:

The Wisconsin National Guard Fire Departments (115 FW FD and 128 ARW FD), will provide fire suppression, EMS, and search and rescue support to civil authorities

## Cumulative totals for 2014:

- Responded to 21 fire missions
- Responded to 02 Aircraft Landing Emergencies

## Result:

WING FDs were requested under previously established mutual aid agreements.





# WING Fire Response Highlights



**128th ARW FD Support:** On 30 JUN 14, the 128ARW Fire Department responded to a structure fire in Cudahy and was assigned to relieve an attack crew in extinguishing fire in accordance with a mutual aid agreement.

**128th ARW FD Support:** On 19 JUN 14, the 128th ARW Fire Department responded to a structure fire in South Francis in accordance with a mutual aid agreement. 128th crews participated in teardown and command functions.

**128th ARW FD Support:** On 12 MAR 14, the 128th ARW Fire Department was dispatched to a structure fire in Cudahy and assisted by opening roof and extinguishing smoldering fires in accordance with a mutual aid agreement.

**128th ARW FD Support:** On 01 MAR 14, the 128th ARW Fire Department was dispatched to a house fire in Greenfield and assisted with ventilation in accordance with a mutual aid agreement.





# State-wide Interoperable Mobile Communications Exercise (SIMCOM)

## Situation:

- On 15 MAY 14, SIMCOM 2014 was held in Oshkosh, WI, sponsored by Winnebago County Emergency Management, Wisconsin National Guard, and Wisconsin Emergency Management. There were 230 participants from numerous agencies.

## Location:

- Sunnyview Expo Center, Oshkosh, WI

## Exercise Objectives:

- To improve planning, operational communications, and operational coordination by incorporating various mobile emergency communications platforms from federal, state, military, tribal, local and non-government organizations





# Vigilant Guard - Alaska

**Situation:** From 26 MAR 14 – 02 APR 14, 30 WING members (J6, PAO, JISSC, J3), participated in AKNG's Vigilant Guard exercise involving local, state, and national agencies to test the response and coordination of different agencies in a disaster scenario. The scenarios included hazardous material detection and response, search and rescue, triage, casualty evacuation, communication support, and transportation support.

**Locations:** Anchorage, Matanuska Valley, Valdez, Fairbanks, Cordova and Kodiak Alaska

## **Exercise Objectives:**

- Provide realistic training venues and scenarios for military and civilian domestic operations organizations
- Allow participants an opportunity to self evaluate Essential and Supporting Mission Tasks
- Allow interagency organizations the opportunity to exercise Command and Control of emergency response

## Situation:


- From 16-20 JUN 14, members of the WI-Joint Staff and 64<sup>th</sup> Troop Command participated in a full-scale multi-state level exercise designed to simulate a catastrophic earthquake along the New Madrid Fault Line.

## Location:

- JFHQ-WI, Madison, with a contingent (64 TC, A Team LNO, White Cell) in Springfield, IL

## Exercise Objectives:

- To swiftly deploy and support another state responding to a catastrophic incident while refining skill-sets in a DOMOPS environment.





# Operation Shave Ice

## Situation:

On 19 FEB 2014, WI Governor Scott Walker declared a state of emergency in response to a major winter storm throughout Wisconsin.


## Mission:

WING pre-staged 10 x Winter Storm (Community/Highway Assistance Team) Force Packages (FP#7) in accordance with WING OPLAN 14-01. Capable of conducting operations for 24 hours in support of State and local authorities for the following mission set:

- Provide mobility and manpower to augment civil efforts to close roads
- Aid stranded motorists
- Perform welfare checks
- Conduct route reconnaissance

## Result:

WING Force Packages responded to two missions in support of local law enforcement.


# Operation Contagion

## **Situation:**

As of 15 Oct 14, there have been 8,997 total cases of Ebola virus disease (EVD) reported in the African region and 4,493 fatalities in Guinea, Liberia, Nigeria, and Sierra Leone. The current EVD outbreak in West Africa has increased the possibility of patients with EVD traveling from the affected countries to the United States.

## **Mission:**

On order, the Wisconsin National Guard provides Joint Healthcare Assistance Team(s) (JHATs) comprised of trained Army and Air Force medical staff and Safety Officers (DECON Specialists) to medical facilities within the State in order to support medical care professionals and render assistance to the citizens of the State of Wisconsin.

## Situation:

The National Guard's State Partnership Program links U.S. states with foreign nations to promote and enhance bilateral relations. It supports homeland defense by nurturing dependable collaborative partners for coalition operations in an era of persistent conflict. Through this program, Wisconsin is proud to be partnered with the country of Nicaragua.

## Mission:

Enhance regional combatant commanders' ability to establish enduring military-military relationships that improve long-term international security while promoting interoperability across all levels of society.

## Objectives:

- Expand and sustain military professional relationships between U.S. and partner nation forces
  - Demonstrate military subordination and support to civil authority
  - Assist with development of democratic institutions
  - Foster open market economies to help develop stability

# Counterdrug

*Safeguarding Wisconsin's Future*

## Mission:

The Wisconsin National Guard Counterdrug Program supports our communities by providing:

- Criminal analyst support to local, state and federal law enforcement
- Training facilities at Volk Field
- RC26B aircraft for nationwide aerial reconnaissance

The Counterdrug program provides our stakeholders with unique military skills and resources to reduce illegal drug activities within our communities.

## FY14 Impact:

Criminal analyst support results:

- \$23M in seized assets
- 2,230 drug related arrests

Provided training support to **7,864** law enforcement and military personnel through the use of the following Counterdrug training facilities at Volk Field:

- High Risk Entry Facility (HREF)
- Leadership development Course (LDC)
- Tactical training village
- classrooms





# Counterdrug

*Safeguarding Wisconsin's Future*



## FY14 Impact (cont):

The RC26B aircraft and crew provided law enforcement with full motion video, ground-to-air communication capabilities and the ability to perform day/night reconnaissance.

## Counterdrug Highlights:

*In FY14, an intelligence analyst from WI Counterdrug working at a local agency worked a case in which agents disrupted a large marijuana grow operation resulting in a seizure of 1,124 marijuana plants totaling over \$2.8 million and 40 lbs of processed marijuana totaling \$100,000.*

*A WI intelligence analyst supported a 13-month drug trafficking investigation with the Organized Crime Drug Task Force (OCDTF). This led to the seizure of three franchise restaurants worth \$2.1 million, several pounds of high grade marijuana, four hand guns, seven rifles, approximately \$90,000 in cash, two homes and four vehicles.*
