SUBJECT: SITUATION REPORT #2 ON SEVERE WEATHER

OVERVIEW – Flash flood warnings are in effect for Green, Grant, Kenosha, Racine, Walworth, Rock, Dodge, Washington, Dane, Iowa, Jefferson, Milwaukee, Waukesha and Sauk Counties.

Below are the latest damage reports as of 9:45 p.m.:

Jefferson County - Experiencing localized flooding, lightning strikes and power issues in Lake Mills, Johnson Creek, Watertown, Ixonia and Jefferson.

Dane County - Sun Prairie Police Department reports that all NB/SB of US 151 are blocked at Exit 101 (W. Main Street) due to complete road flooding.

Iowa County - Several reports of possible tornados.

Milwaukee County - I-43 northbound exit to Kilbourn Tunnel is closed at this time due to flooding. US-45 SB traffic at Hampton Avenue has been reopened. Localized flooding in Whitefish Bay, Shorewood and Wauwatosa. Whitefish Bay Village Hall is flooded and dispatch was moved. Miller Parkway south from I-94 is flooded and closed. Northshore Fire Department requested a MABAS Task Force from Div 119, Ozaukee County, to assist with reports of natural gas leaks.

City of Milwaukee – City Emergency Operations Center activated at 2000. They have fully activated the city call center staff (286 CITY). Mayor Barrett noted that some areas of the city saw up to 7.5 inches of rain over a two-hour period. Two people struck by lightning and taken to St. Luke’s Medical Center. There is a sink hole at Oakland and North.
