Weather

Another round of storms will move across Wisconsin on Wednesday. The Storm Prediction Center has all of southern Wisconsin in a Slight Risk for severe storms with threat of large hail, strong winds and isolated tornado. The Southwest area looks to have the greatest threat for high rainfall amounts. Expected amounts are between 1/2 to 1 inch of rain but some areas could see higher amounts.

River Levels

Flood warnings remain in effect for the Baraboo, Pecatonica, Sugar, Turtle Creek, Kickapoo, Trempealeau and Fox Rivers.

State of Emergency

Governor Walker declared a State of Emergency for 20 Wisconsin counties due to flooding. The counties in the declaration are Buffalo, Crawford, Dane, Grant, Green, Iowa, Jackson, Juneau, Kenosha, La Crosse, Lafayette, Monroe, Pepin, Racine, Richland, Rock, Sauk, Trempealeau, Vernon and Walworth Counties.

Volunteer Agencies

American Red Cross - One shelter remains open at the Cassville High School shelter. Last night there were a total of 5 people. Clean-up kits and other supplies are available in the Village of Ontario, Cassville Fire Department, Potosi Fire Department and Soldiers Grove Fire Department. Since the first flooding incident began in the Southeast Region, 206 cases have been opened. Virtual casework is fully staffed and answering hotline calls at 866-515-4548. Damage assessment teams are working in southwest Wisconsin as assigned. To date, 301 volunteers and staff have been assigned to the southeast, west central and southwest flooding incidents.

Team Rubicon - Team Rubicon arrived in Racine County today to begin assessments. Strike teams are anticipated to begin clean-up operations this week.

The Sharing Center - The Sharing Center partnered with a group of approximately 160 unaffiliated volunteers that assisted with clean up within Salem Lakes and Camp Lake areas in Kenosha County this past weekend.

The State Emergency Operations Center is at Level 4.
